

How the £150M Warm Homes Fund can help you reduce fuel poverty and achieve EESSH.

Round 1 of the Warm Homes Fund (WHF) closed in September 2017 with 43 Registered Social Landlords progressing to contract discussions and likely to secure a chunk of £32M to help fund the capital cost of new central heating systems for non-gas, fuel poor households.



Round 2 opens for new applications in November 2017 and the Turner Group is offering funding through its renewable heating installation business, Ecoliving. This enables more households to benefit and consequently increases the probability of a successful WHF application.

Successful bids should be able to demonstrate:

- that other sources of funding are in place
- a delivery mechanism that is ready to mobilise
- the number of fuel poor households supported
- value for money, including the ability to leverage in funding whilst ensuring additionality
- the benefit created by the intervention (increases in energy efficiency, notional bill savings)
